The Part D donut hole, also called the coverage gap, is now closed for both generic and brand-name drugs. Beneficiaries pay, on average, 25% co-insurance when they pass the initial coverage period of their drug plan.

Services provided at certified opioid treatment programs are now covered by Medicare. As part of the treatment, methadone can be prescribed. Two other Food and Drug Administration-approved medications are also covered.

Extra Help reduces the out-of-pocket costs for Medicare prescription drug coverage. Income and asset requirements must be met.
